MORE THAN 450 YOUTH ARTISTS TO PERFORM ON STAGE AT KAUFFMAN CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS FOR FUTURE STAGES FESTIVAL

Free community event connects youth and families with Kauffman Center arts experiences, creates opportunities for youth to perform on stages from noon-5 p.m. on June 22^{nd}

Kansas City, MO – Since opening in September of 2011, more than one million visitors have attended an event at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts. To celebrate this milestone, Kauffman Center is hosting a new, free community event: **Future Stages Festival**.

Future Stages Festival will be held at the Kauffman Center on Sunday, June 22, 2014 from 12 pm – 5pm and invites the community to experience a diverse range of performance and interactive arts activities. The one-day festival, an extension of the Kauffman Center's Open Doors Spotlight on Youth program, also provides opportunities for youth and arts organizations to perform on stage at Kauffman Center.

"We are committed to encouraging students and young artists to participate in creative endeavors. Future Stages Festival will provide opportunities for future artists to take center stage at the Kauffman Center," stated Jane Chu, President & CEO of Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts.

More than 450 artists from the Greater Kansas City community are anticipated to perform on Kauffman Center stages as part of Future Stages Festival. 24 performing arts organizations were selected to perform after a community request for performance group nominations resulted in more than 130 submissions. In addition, the Kauffman Center's resident companies, the Kansas City Ballet, Kansas City Symphony and Lyric Opera of Kansas City will take part in the event. Families and young people attending the event are invited to participate in interactive arts and crafts activities throughout the day.

Future Stages Festival is open to the public and attendees are encouraged to register for free at kauffmancenter.org/futurestages or by phone at (816) 994-7222 to receive the latest event updates and schedule for performances and activities. All ages are welcome and programming is suggested as most suitable for families with youth ages 4 - 15.
